In **Da Vinci High School International** we give our students the tools they will need, no only to adapt to the new reality but to create their own future, their opportunities and their success. Our educational system is based on three principles: **Core Values, Academic Excellence, and Independence**.

• From 9th to 12th Grade, it is vital to teach and train our students in a life style based on values such as respect, honesty, and self-control. We train them into respecting and finding the value in people around them.

• Academically speaking, we want them to achieve their maximum potential, we challenge our students to work hard in pursue of their goals for their own education.

• We also teach our students to become independent in their academic work. Responsibility leads them to freedom, and the result of that combination is excellence.

Tools to equip our students

The best we can do for our students is to coach them on individual basis. They all have different personalities, learning styles and abilities. We have one teacher for every six to eight students in all our classes.

We make sure that our students have real access to one-on-one learning time with the teacher during the day. All of our teachers are experts in tutoring and coaching.

US Accredited Curriculum

As part of our vision for the future, we offer to our students the possibility of a US Accredited curriculum that will grant them the opportunity to test for any university in the US and in most countries in the world.

We currently have three schools in the states through which we work to have our high school students following a US accredited curriculum.

One is Bridgeway Academy based in Pennsylvania, another one is Citizen High School based in Florida, and the third one we use is Smart Horizons Career Online High School also from Florida.

Most of our students get enrolled in Bridgeway Academy, which has obtained accreditation through Cognia which includes, NCA CASI, NWAC, SACS CASI, The National Association of Private Schools, the Pennsylvania Department of Education, and The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the review of their accreditation and requirements is done yearly.

Multicultural & International Approach

Our task is to form Global Citizens capable of functioning in a changing world. Our team is made up of teachers from different countries with a strong commitment to these goals.

High School plus Associate Degree

Some of our students make the decision of advancing their studies at a fast pace, as a result they can finish their High School program before four years.

For those students we offer a combination of High School plus Associate Degree Diploma with training and practice in several fields such as Education, Arts, Music, International Relations, Psychology and Design.

Art and Music

The journal Neurological Research published a study indicating that students who play instruments or get involved in singing or other music activities improve 27% higher on tests than teens who focus only on Math. At Da Vinci International School we consider Music to be of vital importance for student's academic advancement. In the same way, art classes are part of the curriculum and no merely activities to fill up time or entertain the students.

Physical Activities

Da Vinci International School has developed a program by which all our students exercise on daily basis. Every morning we complete between 40 and the 50 minutes of combined work out (cardio, body work, etc.). We also offer sports such as basketball, Volleyball and Soccer before starting classes.

Life skills for a smooth transition into adulthood

As our teens become young adults, developing the skills they will need to face life is crucial, and high school is the place to start such training. We teach them how to face life beside the academics through our Life Skills Program.

Structure of the academic program

Our students will receive a curriculum tailored to

their specific situation, academic plans and learning capabilities. At the same time we make sure that the curriculum meets all US Accreditation requirements. The number of credits at the end of High School will be 24 or more, making their diploma eligible to get into any university.

An example of the subjects and areas covered by the High School College Prep Program is as follows, a total of 24 credits and a GPA of 3.0 or higher is our standard.





School Facilities

Da Vinci International School was established in 2008, on the top of a hill in Uruma City, Okinawa.

The beauty of the surroundings, along with the peace and calm of the countryside, make Da Vinci an ideal place to develop an educational program for our teens. In 2025 Da Vinci has open its second campus "Nikoma" in Onnason. The concept of our Nikoma Campus responds to the nature of Okinawa, making it the first "School/Resort" campus in the island.



PILLARS OF WELLBEING

For 16 years, the Da Vinci team has been researching, developing, and improving a unique approach to education.

We've trained with experts from Oxford, Harvard, the UN's University for Peace, and others. Using this knowledge, we created the 7 PILLARS of Well-being, which form the heart of our program. Instead of teaching these as separate subjects, we integrate them into daily learning. Our goal is to help students develop happy, well-rounded lives while achieving academic success, emotional well-being, and strong social skills.

1. High Academic Standards

Our small class sizes and personalized tutoring help students develop a love for learning, strong self-discipline, and the ability to set and achieve goals. This approach encourages independent thinking and a passion for knowledge.

2. Core Moral Values

The ability to make good choices is the foundation of a meaningful life. We focus on five essential values:

- **Respect** Treating others with kindness, listening attentively, and showing empathy.
- **Honesty** Building trust by being truthful and avoiding dishonesty.
- Responsibility Understanding the impact of one's actions and taking ownership.
- **Teamwork** Cooperating, trusting others, and working towards common goals.
- **Effort** Persevering, working hard, and acting with integrity.

We teach these values through discussions, role-playing, daily expectations, and leading by example.

3. Relationship Skills

Healthy relationships are key to personal and professional success. Since social skills are not automatic, we teach students:

- How to express and understand emotions
- How to make and keep friends
- How to resolve conflicts peacefully
- How to listen actively
- How to work as a team
- How to recognize the right time and place for certain behaviors

By building these skills, students gain confidence and form strong, lasting connections.

4. Self-Control & Stress Management

Managing frustration and stress is a vital skill. We build strong relationships with students through play, conversation, art, and music, then teach them:

- Stress management How to prevent and calm stress.
- Conflict resolution Solving problems independently and through example.
- **Resilience** Accepting failure and learning from setbacks.
- Goal setting Identifying problems, making a plan, and following through.

These skills help students navigate challenges with confidence.

5. Physical Development

Daily physical activity (45-60 minutes) is a core part of our program. Exercise enhances learning by improving:

- **Memory & problem-solving** Boosting brain function and neuroplasticity.
- **Focus & attention** Increasing concentration and reducing stress.
- Hyperactivity regulation Providing an outlet for energy and improving self-control.
- Motor skills Developing coordination, balance, and dexterity.
- Social skills Encouraging teamwork, cooperation, and communication.

This structured approach improves both academic performance and personal well-being.

6. No Homework

We believe in a balanced life. Our no-homework policy allows students to enjoy family time, hobbies, and extracurricular activities without the burden of extra assignments. Our structured school day ensures they receive a full education during class, reducing stress and improving well-being.

7. No Bullying

We are committed to a safe, inclusive environment. Our anti-bullying program includes prevention strategies, immediate intervention, and restorative practices. Faculty are trained to recognize and address bullying, and students are encouraged to speak up.

A bullying-free school leads to:

- **Higher academic achievement** Students focus better when they feel safe.
- **Better emotional well-being** Less anxiety and stress.
- **Stronger social skills** Encouraging kindness and respect.
- Higher self-confidence Creating a positive selfimage.
- More school engagement Students attend regularly when they feel supported.

By fostering a culture of respect and empathy, we ensure all students feel valued and secure.

SPECIAL SUPPORT PROGRAMS

High School English Support Program

Our program helps non-native English speakers learn the language while keeping up with their high school education in a supportive environment.

Key Features:

- 1. ESL & Phonics Students receive daily English as a Second Language (ESL) lessons and phonics as well as reading comprehension lessons to help them understand core subjects.
- **2. Gradual English Immersion** As language skills improve, students transition from **supported learning** to full English instruction at their own pace.
- **3. Social & Academic Integration** Conversation groups, peer tutoring, and extracurricular activities help students practice English while building friendships and confidence.

Goal: To develop English fluency while ensuring academic success and preparation for college and careers.

Adaptation Program

Helping Teens Return to School

For students struggling with school attendance, our **Adaptation Program** offers a gradual, flexible approach to ease them back into a routine.

- 1. Starting Small The student begins with one 45minute class per day, attending one to three days a week to build comfort and connections.
- **2. Gradual Increase** We slowly add **more days or longer class periods**, adjusting at a pace agreed upon by the student, parents, and teachers.
- **3. Continued Progress** Attendance expands step by step until the student reaches a full schedule.

Final Goal: Regular full-time attendance, though the process may take weeks, or even months, depending on individual needs. Our focus is on support and flexibility to help each student succeed. Many families have already been changed through the effectiveness of this program.

Accelerated High School Program

The Accelerated High School Program allows highly motivated students to complete high school in three years instead of four. This program is designed for students who are ready to take on a more challenging academic path while maintaining strong performance.

Students advance by taking additional courses each year and may have opportunities for independent study, dual enrollment, or specialized learning tracks. With guidance from our teachers and counselors, they receive the support needed to manage their workload and stay on track.

This program is ideal for students who are academically prepared, disciplined, and eager to move forward in their education. Graduating early allows them to **pursue college, vocational training, or career opportunities** sooner, giving them a head start on their future.

Transportation to and from Da Vinci International

We offer safe and reliable transportation across Okinawa to our **Uruma Campus**.

Our microbus service is fully operated by **Da Vinci-trained teachers and drivers**, ensuring a secure and comfortable journey for students.

All transportation to and from sports activities is included at no extra cost, allowing students to participate without additional travel expenses.
